NOTICE IN TERMS OF SECTION 12 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT: MUNICIPAL  
STRUCTURES ACT, 1998:

ESTABLISHMENT OF MUNICIPALITIES (DC 22, KZ 221, KZ 222, KZ 223, KZ 224,  
KZ 225, KZ 226, KZ 227, KZDMA 22)

THE Minister of Traditional Affairs, Safety and Security and of Local Government, in his capacity as the Member of the Executive 1 Council responsible for Local Government in the province of KwaZulu-Natal, has, under the powers vested in him by sections 12 and 14 read with section 93(1) of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act 117 of 1998) disestablished the existing municipalities referred to in the Schedule hereto and established the new municipalities as set out and in terms of the Schedule hereto and has made provision for transitional measures to facilitate the disestablishment of existing municipalities and the establishment of new municipalities and for the regulation of matters that may facilitate the application of the provisions of the said Act.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

CHAPTER 1 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Definitions

1. In this Schedule, unless the context otherwise indicates or unless redefined herein, a word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act, 1998, has the same meaning and -

"administrative unit" means the assets, rights, duties, obligations, liabilities, staff, conditions of service (including individual contracts of service, if any), accounting methods and books of account, administrative directives and administrative records and the area of a disestablished municipality;

"CMC" means the Change Management Committee established in terms of this Schedule;

"Constitution" means the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 (Act No. 108 of 1996);

"demarcation notice" means the relevant Municipal Notice or Notices specified in the Annexure hereto;

"disestablished municipality" means an existing municipality disestablished in terms of this Schedule;

"district municipal area" means the area determined as DC 22 in the demarcation notice;

"district municipality" means the Category C municipality established in terms of this Schedule;

"effective date" means the day on which the first election of the respective municipal councils of the district municipality and the local municipalities in the district municipal area commences as contemplated in section 12(2)(b) of the Act;

"existing municipality" includes

(a) the following Local Councils and Regional Councils established by Proclamation in terms of section 10 of the Local Government Transition Act, 1993 (Act 209 of 1993):

- (ii) Dalton Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG56, 1995)

- (v) Howick Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG90, 1995)
- (vi) Hilton Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG89, 1995)
- (vii) Impendle Transitional Local Council (Proclamation 71, 1996)
- (viii) Ashburton Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG68, 1995)
- (ix) Pietermaritzburg-Msundozi Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG73, 1995)
- (x) Camperdown Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG45, 1994)
- (xi) Richmond Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG113, 1995)
- (xii) Mooi River Transitional Local Council (Proclamation LG49, 1995)

- (b) uMsekeli, to the extent that it is the local authority of or local government body performing local government functions in respect of the following areas:

  - (iii) Harburg
  - (iv) Trust Feed
  - (v) Fort Nottingham
  - (vi) Lidgetton West
  - (vii) Midmar
  - (viii) Mount Dragon
  - (ix) Sierra Ranch
  - (x) Boston
  - (xi) Portion of Thornville
  - (xii) Manderston
  - (xiii) Living Waters

"head of administrative unit" means the person who immediately before the disestablishment of an existing municipality was the chief executive officer/town clerk of that municipality;

"local municipality" means a Category B municipality established in terms of this Schedule;

"MEC" means the Member of the Executive Council responsible for Local Government in the province of KwaZulu-Natal;

"new municipality" means a district municipality or a local municipality, as the case may be, established in terms of this Schedule; "proportionally elected councilors" means councillors elected to proportionally represent the parties that contested the election in the municipality concerned;

"the Act" means the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act, 1998 (Act 117 of 1998);

"uMsekeli" means

- (a) the Development and Services Board constituted in terms of section 2 of the Development and Services Board Ordinance, 1941 (Ordinance No. 20 of 1941) as amended; and
- (b) the Townships Board established in terms of the repealed

Regulations for the Administration and Control of Certain Urban Areas, 1983 (Proclamation No. 67 of 1983) and which continues to exist in terms of section 15(1) of the Local Government Transition Act, 1993 both (a) and (b) read with Proclamation No. 100, 1996, Proclamation No. 20, 1997, Proclamation No. 8 of 1999; and

"ward councillor" means a councillor elected to directly represent a ward.

#### Disestablishment of existing municipalities

2. (1) The existing municipalities are disestablished to the extent that those municipalities fall within the areas of new municipalities with effect from the effective date.

(2) As contemplated in section 159(3) of the Constitution and from the effective date the municipal council of a disestablished municipality remains competent to function as the municipal council for the area of the disestablished municipality until the results of the first election of the municipal councils of the district municipality and the local municipalities in the district municipal area are declared in terms of section 190(1)(c) of the Constitution.

(3) The councillors of an existing municipality vacate office upon the declaration of the results of the election as contemplated in subparagraph (2).

#### Establishment of municipalities

3. (1) Municipalities are hereby established for the district municipal area as set out in Parts 2-9 of this Schedule.

(2) The establishment of the municipalities mentioned in subparagraph (1) takes effect on the effective date.

#### Status

4. A new municipality has the legal status accorded to such municipality in terms of national legislation.

### CHAPTER 2 - TRANSITIONAL MEASURES

#### Legal succession

5. (1) Subject to the provisions set out in paragraphs 6 and 7 of Part I of this Schedule, a new municipality is the successor in law with regard to the area of a disestablished municipality to the extent that the whole or any portion of the said area falls within the boundaries of such new municipality: Provided that where a function or power of such disestablished municipality is, in terms of section 84 or 85 of the Act, a function or power of a municipality other than the said new municipality, such other municipality is the successor in law with regard to the following matters-

(a) such function or power;

(b) the performance of a function or the exercise of a power in relation to the continued application of any by-law, regulation or resolution of such disestablished municipality where such application requires the deployment by such other municipality of its staff; and

(c) the staff, assets, rights, liabilities and obligations of such disestablished municipality that were, immediately before the effective date, predominantly deployed in respect of, or related to, the performance of any of the aforementioned functions or the exercise of any of the aforementioned powers in the said area.

(2) In terms of section 84(1)(p) of the Act read with section 229 of the Constitution, the district municipality may, at rates determined by its municipal council with the concurrence of the Member of the Executive Council responsible for Finance and of the Minister of Finance, levy and claim the levies referred to in section 12(1)(a) of the Regional Services Council Act, 1985 (Act 109 of 1985) or section 16(1)(a) of the KwaZulu and Natal Joint Services Act, 1990 (Act 84 of 1990), as the case may be.

#### Transfer of assets, rights, liabilities and obligations

6. (1) The assets, rights, liabilities and obligations of a disestablished municipality, in so far as they were, immediately before the effective date, predominantly deployed in respect of, or related to, the performance by that municipality of a function or functions in a specific area, are hereby, subject to sections 16(1) and 85 of the Act, transferred to that new municipality (if any) which on the effective date has sole responsibility for the performance of the said function or functions in the said area

(2) Those of the aforementioned assets comprising investments, cash and current credit balances in the accounts of a financial institution, in so far as they were, immediately before the effective date, exclusively related to the performance by the disestablished municipality of a function or functions in a specific area, are hereby, subject to sections 16(1) and 85 of the Act, transferred to that new municipality (if any) which, on the effective date, has sole responsibility for the performance of the said function or functions in the said area.

(3) For the purpose of sub-paragraphs (1) and (2), function includes a power.

(4) Administrative and other records relating to the assets, rights, liabilities and obligations referred to in sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) vest, as from the effective date, in the municipality to which the respective assets, rights, liabilities and obligations are transferred in terms of the said subsections.

(5) Assets, rights, liabilities and obligations other than those referred to in sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) are hereby transferred as from the effective date to the new local municipality in whose area the administrative entity responsible for administrative control of such assets, rights, liabilities and obligations, immediately before the effective date, is located.

(6) A new municipality shall, pending the review referred to in sub-paragraph (7), in exercising its powers, performing its functions and discharging its duties, make use of the assets and rights that were associated with such activities immediately before the effective date.

(7) The transfers mentioned in this paragraph must be reviewed and dealt with by the CMC referred to in paragraph 10 of Part 1 of this Schedule.

#### Transfer of staff

7. (1) The transfer of staff from a disestablished municipality to a

new municipality is subject to compliance with the provisions of the Act, applicable labour law, and the relevant obligations imposed by the Constitution, and in particular the following obligations-

- (a) to give priority in the structuring and management of a municipality's administration and in its budgeting and planning processes to the basic needs of the community and to the promotion of the social and economic development of the community. (section 153(a) of the Constitution); and
- (b) to ensure the provision of services to communities in a sustainable manner and making efficient, economic and effective use of its resources while addressing the need to redress the imbalances of the past (sections 152 and 195 of the Constitution).

(2) Unless inconsistent with any of the provisions or obligations referred to in sub-paragraph (1), the said staff are transferred, as from the effective date, as follows:

- (a) an employee who, while employed by the disestablished municipality, was for the greater part of a normal working day carrying out duties directly related to the performance of a function or functions in a specific area, is transferred, subject to sections 16(1) and 85 of the Act, to the service of that new municipality (if any) which, on the effective date, has sole responsibility for the performance of the said function or functions in the said area;
- (b) an employee other than one referred to in (a) above, is transferred to the service of the new local municipality in whose area the administrative entity responsible for staff administration relating to such employee immediately before the effective date, is located;
- (c) for the purposes of (a) above, function includes a power;
- (d) an employee referred to in (a) or (b) above is transferred to the new municipality on terms and conditions no less favourable than those under which such employee served immediately before the effective date;
- (e) a transfer referred to in (d) above, must be reviewed and dealt with by the appropriate CMC referred to in paragraph 10 of Part I of this Schedule, in terms of sub-paragraph (1); and
- (f) a new municipality shall, pending the review referred to in paragraph (e) above, in exercising its powers, performing its functions and discharging its duties, make use of the staff that were associated with such activities immediately before the effective date.

#### Administrative units

8. (1) Notwithstanding the fact that the assets, rights, duties, obligations, liabilities and staff of a disestablished municipality are in terms of this Schedule vested in or transferred to a new municipality, the administrative units shall, insofar as is practicable, continue (on a transitional basis) to function as such in terms of the administrative, accounting, human resource management and other like structures, systems, rules and regulations which were applicable immediately prior to the establishment of the said new municipality until changed by the new municipality or pursuant to the rationalisation process contemplated in paragraph 10 of Part 1 of the Schedule.

- (2) (a) The head of an administrative unit shall remain competent to function as such but shall act under the direction of and be responsible and accountable to the municipal manager or acting municipal manager (as the case may be) of the new municipality with regard to all aspects of the continued operation of the said administrative unit.
- (b) Where the head of the administrative unit is the designatee contemplated in paragraph 11 of Part 1 of this Schedule that person also remains competent to function as the head of the administrative entity: Provided that the designatee may delegate all or some of his functions as head of the administrative unit to his or her immediate subordinate in such unit.
- (c) Where the designatee no longer performs the functions contemplated in paragraph 11 of Part 1 of this Schedule such person reverts to the position held in the disestablished municipality.

(3) For the purposes of section 16 of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act No. 85 of 1993) and until the municipal council makes an appointment in terms of the said section, the head of an administrative unit shall be deemed to be the chief executive officer in respect of the activities of the administrative unit.

#### Continued application of by-laws

9. (1) All by-laws, regulations and resolutions that apply in the area of a disestablished municipality immediately before the effective date, continue to apply in such area from the effective date subject to any amendment or repeal by the council of the new municipality.

(2) Unless inconsistent with the context or clearly inappropriate, reference in any such by-law regulation or resolution to-

- (a) a disestablished municipality, must be construed as a reference to the new municipality; and
- (b) a structure or functionary of a disestablished municipality, must be construed as a reference to the corresponding structure or functionary in the administrative entity.

#### Change management

10. (1) (a) In terms of section 14(2)(b) and (5) of the Act and for the purpose of transitional regulation of the legal, practical and other consequences of the disestablishments effected by paragraph 2 and the establishments effected by paragraph 3, and pending further regulation thereof in terms of section 16(1)(h) of the Act, there is hereby established a CMC for the district municipal area.

(b) The establishment of the CMC shall take effect no later than twenty-eight (28) days after the effective date and the composition of the CMC will be determined by further regulation in terms of section 16(1)(h) of the Act.

(2) The functions of the CMC shall, subject to and for the purposes of sections 84 and 85 of the Act, be to recommend to the MEC:

- (a) which of the assets, rights, liabilities and obligations that have been transferred from a disestablished municipality shall remain

vested in the transferee and which shall be transferred from the transferee to a new municipality; and

- (b) subject to applicable labour law and paragraphs 7(2) and (3) of Part 1 of this Schedule, implementation of a process of administrative rationalisation including-
- (i) after consultation with an employee and his or her trade union (if any), agreeing upon the transfer of an employee from the service of one municipality to the service of a new municipality;
  - (ii) after consultation as required in terms of section 189 of the Labour Relations Act, and in terms of paragraph 7 of Part 1 of this Schedule, agreeing upon any reasonable alternative deployment option available in respect of an employee who would otherwise face dismissal based on the operational requirements of the municipality to which he or she has been transferred in terms of paragraph 7 of Part I of this Schedule.
- (c) a process of reviewing the continued application of bylaws, regulations and resolutions of the disestablished municipalities and to make recommendations to the respective new municipalities for the rationalisation, as contemplated in section 15 of the Act, of such bylaws, regulations and resolutions.
- (3) (a) The members of the CMC must endeavour to achieve unanimity on any matter before it, failing which, such matter is decided with a supporting vote of at least a majority of the members present at a meeting.
- (b) In the event of an equality of votes, the Chairperson or member presiding at the meeting may exercise a casting vote in addition to his or her vote as a member of the CMC.
- (c) A majority of the members of the CMC constitutes a quorum for a meeting.
- (d) In the absence of unanimity on any matter which is to be submitted to the MEC for consideration, the report and recommendations of any minority of the members of the CMC must accompany the report and recommendations of the majority of the members.
- (4) (a) Where the CMC has before it any matter within its functions and cannot within sixty (60) days of such matter being brought before it reach a decision thereon, the matter shall be referred to independent mediation and the mediation process shall be completed within thirty (30) days of such referral. The rules governing such mediation and the list of approved mediators shall be as agreed upon by the CMC within fifteen (15) days of the expiry of the-forementioned period of sixty (60) days.
- (b) Where the CMC cannot, within the said period of fifteen (15) days reach agreement as contemplated in (a) above, or where the mediation process does not resolve the matter within the aforementioned period of thirty (30) days, the matter must be submitted to the MEC who may, in his discretion, decide the matter, or may submit it to arbitration by an arbitrator appointed by the MEC, whose decision shall be final and shall

be deemed to constitute a recommendation of the CMC to the MEC on the matter.

(5) Any expense incurred by the CMC in the discharge of its functions or in respect of the costs of mediation in terms of sub-paragraph (4) shall be borne by the municipalities in proportion to their respective numbers of members of the CMC.

#### Acting municipal managers

11. Pending the appointment by the municipal council of a municipal manager or acting municipal manager in terms of section 82 of the Act, the following persons are designated in terms of section 29(2) of the Act to call the first meeting of the council of the new municipality and such persons shall exercise the powers and perform the functions of a municipal manager from the effective date until the council appoints a municipal manager or acting municipal manager.

- (a) Ms N. H. Ally for the district municipality established in terms of Part 2 of this Schedule (DC 22);
- (b) Mr H. D. Gouws for the local municipality established in terms of Part 3 of this Schedule (KZ 221);
- (c) Mr R. Brijraj for the local municipality established in terms of Part 4 of this Schedule (KZ 222);
- (d) Mr M. E. Makathini for the local municipality established in terms of Part 5 of this Schedule (KZ 223);
- (e) Mr B. W. Ntshangase for the local municipality established in terms of Part 6 of this Schedule (KZ 224);
- (f) Mr R. F. Haswell for the local municipality established in terms of Part 7 of this Schedule (KZ 225);
- (g) Mrs F. C. Joubert for the local municipality established in terms of Part 8 of this Schedule (KZ 226);
- (h) Mr G. C. Janse van Vuuren for the local municipality established in terms of Part 9 of this Schedule (KZ 227).

## PART 2

### ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY

1. (1) For the district municipal area as a whole, a district municipality is hereby established.

(2) That part of the district municipal area determined in the demarcation notice as a district management area, is to be managed by the district municipality in terms of section 6 of the Act as a district management area.

### CATEGORY

2. The district municipality is a Category C municipality as determined by the Demarcation Board in terms of section 4 of the Act.

### TYPE

3. The type of the district municipality is that of a collective

executive system as described in the KwaZulu-Natal Determination of Types of Municipality Act, 2000.

#### BOUNDARIES

4. The boundaries of the district municipality are as determined in the demarcation notice for the district municipal area.

#### NAME

5. The name or provisional designation of the district municipality is DC22 Municipality.

#### COUNCILLORS

6.(1) The council of the district municipality consists of 41 councillors as determined in Municipal Notice No. 143 dated 13 July 2000 as corrected by Municipal Notice No. 175 dated 22 August 2000 of whom

- (a) 16 must be proportionally elected councillors,
- (b) 3 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 3 of this Schedule,
- (c) 2 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 4 of this Schedule,
- (d) 1 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 5 of this Schedule,
- (e) 1 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 6 of this Schedule,
- (f) 15 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 7 of this Schedule,
- (g) 1 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 8 of this Schedule,
- (h) 1 must be appointed by the local municipality mentioned in Part 9 of this Schedule,
- (i) 1 must be a proportionally elected councillor to represent voters in the district management area mentioned in paragraph 1(2).

(2) Full time councillors are designated in accordance with the policy framework contemplated in section 18(4) of the Act.

#### SEAT OF FIRST MEETING

7. The seat of the new municipality for the purposes of the first meeting of its council after the effective date shall be Symons Centre Pietermaritzburg until otherwise determined in terms of section 29(1) of the Act.

#### STANDING RULES FOR FIRST MEETING

8. The standing rules and orders for the first meeting of the new municipality shall be those which applied to the disestablished municipality known as iNdllovu Regional Council until otherwise determined by the council.

## PART 3

### ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

1. For that part of the district municipal area determined in the demarcation notice as KZ 221, a local municipality is hereby established.

#### CATEGORY

The local municipality is a Category B municipality as determined by the Demarcation Board in terms of section 4 of the Act.

#### TYPE

3. The type of the local municipality is that of a collective executive system as described in the KwaZulu-Natal Determination of Types of Municipality Act, 2000.

#### BOUNDARIES

4. The boundaries of the local municipality are as determined in the demarcation notice for KZ 221.

#### NAME

5. The name or provisional designation of the local municipality is KZ221 Municipality.

#### COUNCILLORS

6. (1) The council of the local municipality consists of 11 proportionally elected councillors and 11 ward councillors as determined in Municipal Notice 143 dated 13 July 2000 as corrected by Municipal Notice No. 175 dated 22 August 2000.

(2) Full time councillors will be designated in accordance with a policy framework contemplated in section 18(4) of the Act.

#### WARDS

7. The local municipality has 11 wards with boundaries as determined in the demarcation notice.

#### SEAT OF FIRST MEETING

8. The seat of the new municipality for the purposes of the first meeting of its council after the effective date shall be Wartburg Municipal Offices until otherwise determined in terms of section 29(1) of the Act.

#### STANDING RULES FOR FIRST MEETING

9. The standing rules and orders for the first meeting of the new municipality shall be those which applied to the disestablished municipality known as Wartburg Transitional Local Council until otherwise determined by the council.

## PART 4

### ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

1. For that part of the district municipal area determined in the demarcation notice as KZ 222, a local municipality is hereby established.

#### CATEGORY

2. The local municipality is a Category B municipality as determined by the Demarcation Board in terms of section 4 of the Act.

#### TYPE

3. The type of local municipality is that of a collective executive system as described in the KwaZulu-Natal Determination of Types of Municipality Act, 2000.

#### BOUNDARIES

4. The boundaries of the local municipality are as determined in the demarcation notice for KZ 222.

#### NAME

5. The name or provisional designation of the local municipality is KZ222 Municipality.

#### COUNCILLORS

6. (1) The council of the local municipality consists of 10 proportionally elected councillors and 11 ward councillors as determined in Municipal Notice 143 dated 13 July 2000 as corrected by Municipal Notice No. 175 dated 22 August 2000.

(2) Full time councillors will be designated in accordance with a policy framework contemplated in section 18(4) of the Act.

#### WARDS

7. The local municipality has 11 wards with boundaries as determined in the demarcation notice.

#### SEAT OF FIRST MEETING

8. The seat of the new municipality for the purposes of the first meeting of its council after the effective date shall be Howick Municipal Offices until otherwise determined in terms of section 29(1) of the Act.

#### STANDING RULES FOR FIRST MEETING

9. The standing rules and orders for the first meeting of the new municipality shall be those which applied to the disestablished municipality known as Howick Transitional Local Council until otherwise determined by the council.

### PART 5

#### ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

1. For that part of the district municipal area determined in the demarcation notice as KZ 223, a local municipality is hereby established.

#### CATEGORY

2. The local municipality is a Category B municipality as determined by the Demarcation Board in terms of section 4 of the Act.

#### TYPE

3. The type of local municipality is that of a collective executive system as described in the KwaZulu-Natal Determination of Types of Municipality Act, 2000.

#### BOUNDARIES

4. The boundaries of the local municipality are as determined in the demarcation notice for KZ 223.

#### NAME

5. The name or provisional designation of the local municipality is KZ223 Municipality.

#### COUNCILLORS

6. (1) The council of the local municipality consists of 3 proportionally elected councillors and 4 ward councillors as determined in Municipal Notice 143 dated 13 July 2000 as corrected by Municipal Notice No. 175 dated 22 August 2000.

(2) Full time councillors will be designated in accordance with a policy framework contemplated in section 18(4) of the Act.

#### WARDS

7. The local municipality has 4 wards with boundaries as determined in the demarcation notice.

#### SEAT OF FIRST MEETING

8. The seat of the new municipality for the purposes of the first meeting of its council after the effective date shall be Mooi River Municipal Offices until otherwise determined in terms of section 29(1) of the Act.

#### STANDING RULES FOR FIRST MEETING

9. The standing rules and orders for the first meeting of the new municipality shall be those which applied to the disestablished municipality known as Mooi River Transitional Local Council until otherwise determined by the council.

### PART 6

#### ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

1. For that part of the district municipal area determined in the demarcation notice as KZ 224, a local municipality is hereby established.

#### CATEGORY

2. The local municipality is a Category B municipality as determined by the Demarcation Board in terms of section 4 of the Act.

#### TYPE

3. The type of local municipality is that of a collective executive system as described in the KwaZulu-Natal Determination of Types of Municipality Act, 2000.

#### BOUNDARIES

4. The boundaries of the local municipality are as determined in the demarcation notice for KZ 224.

#### NAME

5. The name or provisional designation of the local municipality is KZ224 Municipality.

#### COUNCILLORS
